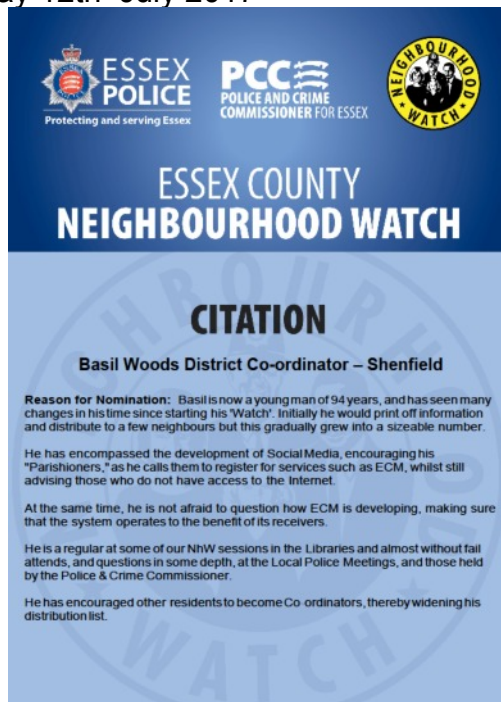


Wednesday 12th July 2017

Clive became his village Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator 25 years ago, he has an infectious personality which enables him to engage with people and encourage them to undertake and achieve.

Over his years of involvement in NHW, firstly at village level and, in latter years, within the Police structure, and now in the District and County NHW, Clive has led from the front. He will not propose issues he is not willing to undertake himself.

A short while ago NHW was floundering slightly and without the determined effort of Clive we would not have the cohesive force of NHW supporters we now have. Clive created a weekly NHW newsletter ground which is distributed to at least 1000 people every week and it is further distributed to many others by those who receive it and now is included on the Essex Police ECM.

Clive was elected Chairman of Braintree District NHW Steering group three years ago and has been responsible for increasing NHW throughout Braintree by not only visiting those who are interested but ensuring that they have full information on how to be involved with NHW. He has given many presentations to various organisations, and he has come up with new ideas to not only raise NHW but to find new ways to raise funds for Braintree District, and he is always available to discuss NHW matters.

Another of Clive's major successes, is with Halstead Steering group joining the Braintree District Steering Group, with meetings changing alternatively at Braintree and Halstead and moving to meeting venues which he has managed to arrange free of charge.

Finally, Clive has also been responsible for the expansion of Halstead NHW (over 40 new members plus street signs being erected), and appointing a Witham NHW Co-ordinator, which has really expanded Witham NHW tremendously!

Since John has taken over as Tendring District Chairman, the Neighbourhood Watch Scheme has gone from strength to strength.

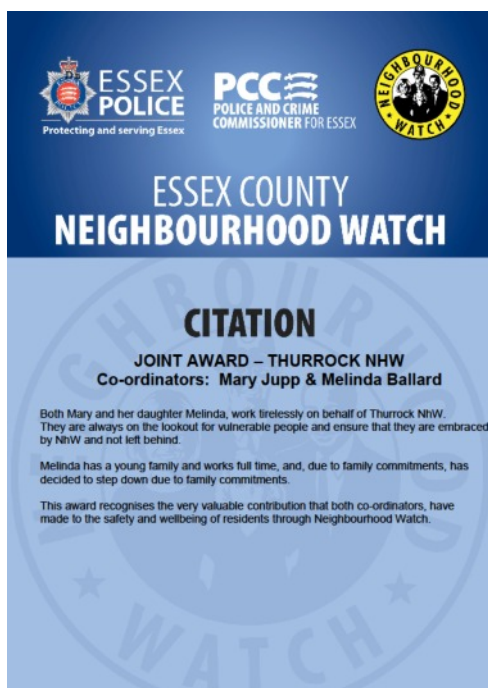
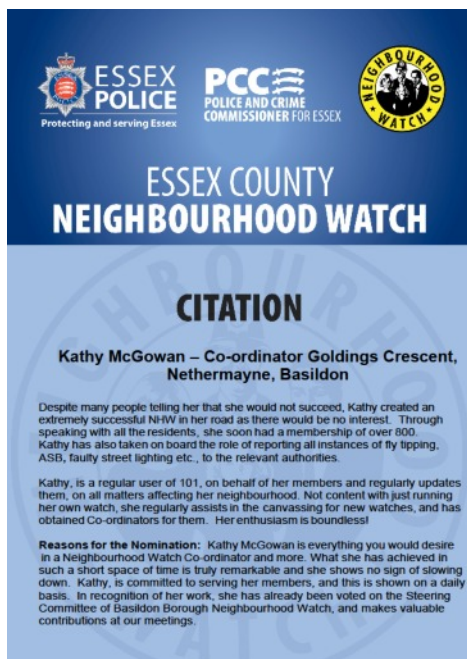
John always attends Community Safety Days with some of his members to try and promote the benefits of NHW and to encourage people to become street co-ordinators.

Debbie first made an approach in becoming a street coordinator on the 16th November 2016 in an area where Neighbourhood Watch has never had a foothold, and Debbie, started her watch on the 22nd November. Her enthusiasm in setting up her scheme has so far been unparalleled in Tendring, and within days she swiftly signed up 70 new members to Neighbourhood Watch. She has made contact with the local Community Policing Team, and has organised local meetings, where she hopes to expand Neighbourhood Watch, to other streets in the area. Debbie, also keeps her members informed by email, or newsletter, of crimes in the area, and other useful information. Together with her husband, they have volunteered to take part in Days of Action in Harwich.


Reasons for the Nomination:-

Debbie is like a breath of fresh air, and radiates confidence to her members, apart from being a street coordinator, she is involved with other voluntary work and teaches four days a week. Debbie is a perfect ambassador for Neighbourhood Watch, and has taken to the task wholeheartedly balancing it with her other duties, and importantly, is not afraid to ask for advice where necessary. Her members now feel more safe and secure, having Debbie in post and knowing that she will support them.

Little Canfield**

Priors Green is a major new development in Little Canfield, near Great Dunmow. As part of a district initiative to extend NHW into new housing schemes, Uttlesford NHW leafletted Priors Green and Beverley immediately responded. She took on the job of Village Coordinator for the whole development, consisting of 488 dwellings, and Beverley, personally contacted all the residents in her road, then spread this across, the whole development.

The unique feature of this scheme is that it is run entirely on the internet based upon a group Facebook account, which means that membership communications are quick, comprehensive and very effective.

Reasons for the Nomination: since starting the Scheme in 2014 Beverley has achieved excellent results, and continues to manage it with a healthy enthusiasm. She exemplifies the importance of recruiting younger people into the NHW movement; she is a working mother with a busy life yet still gives her time and effort to support her community.

She has also 'kick started' us into using social media as a means of communication, and has recently joined the District Steering Group to help us fully exploit this growing opportunity.
